MILAN

Magna Pars is a plush home-away-from-home for design aficionados who appreciate eco-friendly surroundings in a great neighbourhood - this new hotel is found in artsy Zona Tortona. The former perfume factory is powered with renewable energy and, unlike most boutique hotels in the city, there's room for a central garden with olive trees, maples and magnolias. Twenty-eight suites are decked in such covetable Italian finds as Poltronova Frau beds, Lavazza coffee makers, Flos lamps and furniture crafted by local artisans. magnapars-suitesmilano.it



BOSTON

Save room for dessert at Blue Dragon, celebrity chef Ming Tsai's new Fort Point gastro-pub and his first new restaurant opening in 15 years. The Cookie is a warm, deep-dish chocolate chip concoction topped with ice-cream and soy caramel sauce. Dine or patrons can tuck into other American-Asian favourites: pan-fried fish and chips, Korean chicken wings or Indonesian curried lamb shepherd's pie. ATHENS

Sign up for Greek Crisis, a three-hour walking tour offered by Context Travel, and you'll be led around by a resident economist to explore the sights from a fiscal perspective. Ponder the public protests at Syntagma Square in Athens and, as you stroll from the old Greek parliament building to the Central Bank, learn what impact austerity has had on the city.
