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RÝCHORY FOREST

This is a unique nature reserve, where many species of protected plants can be found. Its uniqueness consists especially in its being almost untouched by humans. It is regarded as the least disturbed place in the Krkonoše. It is less than an hour's drive from the hotel and you can also visit Stachelberg fortress on the same trip.

STACHELBERG FORTRESS

This is an absolutely unique place for all military fans. For more than twenty years, a group of enthusiasts have been restoring this fortress with an extensive system of underground passages, which are accessible. Seeing them is a unique experience. Some work has also been done around the fortress and a lookout tower called Eliška was built, from which you can see many peaks of the Krkonoše. There is also a playground for your children.



PECKA CASTLE

This is the only cultural heritage site in the whole region of central Podkrkonoší and of the Krkonoše whose interior is accessible. It offers beautiful views of the Krkonoše ridges. This castle, slated for demolition after many historic events and adversities, was saved by the inhabitants of the village of the same name, Pecka, and gradually reconstructed. Two different tours of the castle are available now



ÚPSKÁ RAŠELINA (ÚPA PEAT BOG)

This nature reserve was founded as early as 1952 and it includes the sources of two rivers, the Úpa and the White Elbe. The tough local climate has preserved its appearance of the subarctic tundra of the Ice Age. You can walk throughout the peat bog on boardwalks. It offers many trails on the Czech-Polish border

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KRKONOŠE BEER TRAIL

There are many interesting things in the Krkonoše and one of them is the history of the beer industry. For this reason, there is a beer trail which takes you to all the well-known as well as lesser-known breweries. The trail is interactive, so you can get stamps in the individual places and get a small present as a keepsake. It is an impressive thirty kilometres long.

ŽALÝ LOOKOUT TOWER

This lookout tower is unique due to its architecture and it is the only stone lookout tower in the Krkonoše. It used to be visited as a pilgrimage place in remote history and it has preserved its special magic until the present time. Right next to the tower, there is an old-style log house which is used as a restaurant.

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BUBÁČEK TRAIN

This is a trackless tourist train intended for anyone who can't go hiking. It offers several tours, which differ in length and locations. The train can be boarded in both directions and it has a regular timetable. It is suitable for mothers with prams as well as for the disabled.



RAUTIS – GLASS BEAD ORNAMENTS FROM PONIKI Á

This family-run company produces blown glass beads and glass bead Christmas ornaments. They have pursued this unique craft since 1902, using traditional technology to make individual jewellery. As a result, they can boast absolute originality and uniqueness. They will be happy to demonstrate their techniques during the tour and at the end of it you can make your own ornaments in their workshop.



LES KRÁLOVSTVÍ RESERVOIR

Les Království Reservoir was built on the Elbe in 1920 as a result of the disastrous flood of 1897. The architects paid a lot of attention to its pseudo-Gothic aesthetic, so it is now a frequented tourist attraction. It is situated in close proximity to the borderland forest called Les Království, after which it was named



JUNKERS 52 AEROPLANE WRECK

At the end of WWII there was an aircraft crash in the Krkonoše. A Junkers JU-52 flew into a snowstorm and crashed head-on into a slope. Gradually, the local inhabitants managed to disassemble the plane and transport it down from Obří hřeben (Giant Ridge). Nowadays, the wreck can be seen at the Information Centre in Malá Úpa.
